





1. Title of the practice

State level Inter collegiate elocution and poetry recitation competitions.

2. Goal

To promote stage courage and creative thinking of college students. To introduce good speakers from other colleges as a roll model in front of our students. To have a loud thinking on current affairs in college staff and students.

3. The context

As the college belongs to rural area, students are not well equipped with stage. Stage courage elocution, debate, poetry recitation, mike sense, eye contact, voice modulation and body language. By organizing state level, inter collegiate elocution and poetry recitation competitions students will get an opportunity to participate with preparation in the competition. They will also listen and observe better examples of students from various colleges all over the state. Their knowledge will also get updated about the current affairs.

4. The Practice

On the very first year of those competitions a good number of students registered their name for participation in these competition. Cultural committee gave a proper guidance to participated students. About twelve students participated in the elocution competitions; whereas 17 students participated in poetry recitation competition. Students from other colleges appeared is a good number they were 38 for elocution and 28 for poetry recitation. Students from the college in urban area made a good performance. Students from our college received ample inspiration. Though these students don't get prizes, they improve a lot in expected area.

5. Evidence of success

Initially students were not ready to participate but continuous follow up and guidance brought them onto the stage. As a good as two dozen students participated in the said competition and two of them received consolation prizes. A drastic change in performance of the students was noticed by all stakeholders.

6. Problems Encountered and resources required

Students were not ready to participate in these state level competitions initially. When few came forth they needed a special guidance cultural committee made a proper guidance for practice and rehearsal. Auditorium is available in the college but a mini theatre will be better.

7. Notes

State levels inter collegiate elocution competition started from 18th August 2017 and will continuous every year. State level inter collegiate Marathi comic poetry recitation competition started from 22nd November 2017 and will continuous every year. Improvement in overall performance in students is noted.

Best Practice: II

1. Title of the practice

e-Commerce, a certificate course for UG students.

2. Goal

To run a certificate course e-Commerce parallel to the regular UG courses of University, so as to impart career oriented programme the students of commerce faculty.

3. The context

Students in the rural area acquire formal education and graduation but they don't have practical knowledge and soft skill. The college has decided to run a certificate course e-Commerce to teach them the process of online transaction, marketing and study of share market. Student after completion of the said short term course are expected to get all possible career options.

4. The Practice

The department of Commerce designed the syllabus for this certificate course which is approved by Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Marathwada University, Aurangabad. Deserving students are enrolled for this course giving performance to the students from reserve category. Separate time-table is prepared for theory and practical. Students are given practical knowledge with computers about online transactions. An examination is conducted at end of the year. Passed students are issued a certificate from college which is approved certificate by University.

5. Evidence of success

In the academic year 18 students were admitted for this certificate course e-Commerce. Almost 15 percent students were placed in neighbouring industry and shops. Three students started working with a local audit offices. Two students mentioned that they faced interview successfully so as to have certificate course along with degree course. The course proved helpful for the self employment also.

6. Problems Encountered and resources required

Students initially hesitated to seek admission, thinking they have to bear fees, later on convincing them they got admitted. Study material, computers and other technical items are required. Inviting expert faculty as a guest lecturer becomes difficult for the lack of funds in honorarium.

7. Notes

The said certificate course 'e-Commerce' proves fruitful. This is the 7th year of our college to run this course. For first five years this course was funded by UGC in XIIth plan but now since 2016-2017 the course is run on self funding base. Faculty of Commerce department work without honorarium.
